BBKA Microscopy Training Course

(originally November 2016, now January 2017)

The first three days in January cover the honeybee anatomy; an understanding of the uses and benefits of Compound and Stereo Microscopes; their set up and care; microscope practical work; bee dissection and slide preparation. It also includes advice on the purchase of equipment – new is not always best.

The fourth day in April is timed to allow attendees to gain some practice and experience from that learnt from the first three days, for attendees to check and discuss progress, and to receive further training.

The Bee inspectors will run through presentations providing up to date details of the various pests and diseases including those that are notifiable, and will demonstrate good husbandry practices to reduce the possibility of bee diseases being spread by the beekeeper.
